## WHERE WE'RE GOING

More than six years into our life as a church (and five years into our Sunday gatherings), we have witnessed a lot of growth and innumerable mercies of God. What could be next?

As our vision statement shows, our first task is to "follow." We're not primarily leading with vision as much as we are following Jesus through prayer and dependence on him. As a result, we don't lay out grand plans and set strategies and key metrics. We seek the Father's face for his will for us as a people, and follow him with happy obedience as he leads us further than we could ever imagine.

How do we sense the Lord leading us together? In the year ahead, we are hoping and praying to see greater depth in the gospel and intimacy with God. We're praying that we'd grow more bold in sharing our faith and more fruitful in celebrating baptisms. We're praying for more growth in attendance, community groups, and kids & student ministries.

Specifically, we sense the Lord leading us into greater stability as a church family. We're not primarily concerned with growing larger or multiplying in this season. We sense the need to put down roots and be more stable as a congregation and organization. To that end, we've been saving funds and seeking the Lord's will for a longterm ministry base, from which we can plant churches, start a nonprofit mercy ministry, and send missionaries out into all the nations. We hope you're as excited as we are, and we ask you again to commit all this to prayer. The Lord is faithful!

## RENEWAL FUND


As we've grown as a church, we see the need to be prayerful and intentional with our funds and future plans. We sense that we will likely need a more permanent facility before focusing on church planting—although that's in our long-term plans. In this season, we want to offer an opportunity to give above your regular tithes to create a financial reserve for our future needs.

We don't anticipate leaving CFS any time soon; we're actively pursuing to renew our lease for several more years. But as CFS is seeing significant growth (and we are too), they may not be able to rent to us forever. In the event that we couldn't meet there much longer, it becomes increasingly difficult to relocate a larger congregation.

The Renewal Fund is not a full campaign; it's a savings account to give us a good foundation for future growth. We envision the need to purchase, renovate, or build a facility in the next five years, and having a portion of the funds already on hand will help us stay focused on ministry. If we wait to intentionally build savings, we run the risk of needing to focus on an intense season of fundraising down the line.

Our Renewal Fund is focused on Trinity's future growth (church building and local church planting) but also includes a minimum of ten percent funding to establish Serve 573, a nonprofit mercy ministry, as well as a global church planting ministry. We anticipate formally starting these two ministries in the next five years also.

What exactly do we anticipate in the next 5-7 years? We're praying for continued sustainable growth. Of course, we're not a strategyled church; we're a prayer-led church. In prayer, we believe God has put in our hearts the desire to reach people locally, plant churches around Central Missouri, meet the practical needs of our community, and equip church planters and missionaries to go out across the country and to the nations. This Renewal Fund is a great next step in seeing all this happen!
